OTTER CREEK ENGINEERING LEAD SURVEY UPDATE

Pittsford has 634 water services and OCE has successfully inventoried 493 of them which puts us at 78% of the way through the system. The vast majority of customer owned services in town are copper and, while Otter Creek Engineering has yet to complete the inventory, they have not found any Lead service connections.

CORRECT MAILING ADDRESS

If you have changed your mailing address in the last year, please notify the Town Clerk's office at (802) 483-6500 ext. 100 or 110 as Town property tax bills were mailed out in July. Having the correct mailing address saves on time and money.

If you are a new owner in Pittsford and have Town water and/or sewer service, please contact the Assistant to the Town Manager's office at (802) 483-6500 ext 130. The next utility bills will be mailed out the end of December. Remember the silver drop box located on the left side of the Town Office front parking lot exit is available 24/7 for payments.

FALL CLEAN-UP REMINDERS!!

REMEMBER.... Open Burning is Prohibited in the following instances:

No person is permitted to open burn: Household Garbage, Tires, Rubber, Plastic, Waste Oil, Asphalt Materials, Materials Containing Asbestos or Pressure Treated Wood.

If you are thinking about starting a legal fire, please get your proper Burn Permit for legal conforming materials such as, a pile of brush or hardwood meant for burning. Those legal materials list can be found under the provisions of Section 5 -201, 5-202 and 5-203. Fire Warden Brad Keith can be reached at (802) 779-2950 for a burn permit.

Another safety tip for this time of year besides fire safety is hiking safety, please "wear your orange" when traversing through the woods, especially remote locations known for hunting. You can never be too visible when on or off a trail so always wear bright clothing, safety shoes, jacket and proper head protection from the elements, the climate can change rapidly throughout the various elevations.

ZONING ADMINISTRATOR: PERMIT REQUIREMENTS FOR SHEDS AND STORAGE

Fall weather often has property owners buying/building Storage Structures to shelter their belongings. A "Structure is an assembly of materials for occupancy or Use", and any permanent Structure (in place for over six months) that is over 150 sq. ft. in area needs a Town permit. This includes shipping containers, fabric & frame tents, sheds on skids, etc. The structure's placement also has to conform to minimum setbacks from property lines.

TRANSFER STATION RENEWAL PERMITS

Transfer Station permits for 2024 will be available at the Town Office starting in Mid-November at 426 Plains Road. Renewal deadline is 1/1/2024. The permit fee is \$30.00 which includes a 10 bag/container (30 gal) punch card. Extra cards available for \$25.00 at the Town Office via cash, check, credit card or debit card or at the Transfer Station by check only. Residents must have new permit stickers by 01/01/2024 in order to use the Transfer Station.

Please remember that the Transfer Station is **open to the public** only on **Wednesdays from 3pm-6pm and Saturdays from 8am-3pm.** Dumping beyond these hours of operation is prohibited and considered theft of services. Violators will be prosecuted.

The Pittsford Transfer Station **does not accept tires.** Please take them to the Gleason Road Transfer Station in Rutland.

The HHW Depot at the Gleason Road Transfer Station in Rutland is open Monday through Saturday 7am to 3pm. Contact Tom Remes at (802) 770-1333 for more information regarding Household Hazardous Waste disposal.

SAFETY CHECK

With the change of seasons comes the threat for inclement weather and the possibility for long-term power outages.

The Pittsford Department of Emergency Management recognizes that this is a major concern for the elderly or those with specific medical needs, such as medication, refrigeration, oxygen therapy or users of any other medical device that relies on power to operate.

To address this concern, we have created a database of Pittsford/Florence residents who might benefit from a "Safety Check" during these times.

If you, a neighbor, family member or other Pittsford resident you know might benefit from a "Safety Check" during a long-term power outage, please contact the Pittsford Town Offices to be added to our list.

ASSESSOR'S CORNER

Assessor's Office Staffing and Hours

The Assessor's Office is staffed by Lisa Wright, Contract Assessor and Karen Folger, Assessor Clerk. Lisa and Karen are in the office on Thursdays, with Lisa's office hours being 9:30 to 1:30 and by appointment.

Information Resource

The Assessor's Office now has GIS available with Property Record Cards (PCR) linked to each parcel. These can be found at either pittsfordvermont.com/departments/assessor or www.axisgis.com/ PittsfordVT. The Property Record Card (AKA Assessor's Card) is a two page synopsis of all information the Assessor has on each property in Town. We suggest that all property owners pick up a copy of the Assessor's Card at the Town Office to be sure that all information is correct. This is especially important if any changes have been made to your property.

<u>Properties under Construction or</u> <u>Building Permits or Demolitions in Progress</u>

The Assessor's Office is charged with assessing all properties as of their status as of 4/1 of the year. If you have a building under construction or a new outbuilding or demo of an existing building and if that job is now complete, we would be happy to inspect this fall. Any work we can complete on under constructions properties in the fall makes our work a bit lighter in the spring.

Pittsford has over 16 miles of trails to enjoy hiking, running or walking. The Cadwell and Split Rock Trails continue to be great for hiking or biking. EMERGENCY ALERTS FROM CHITTENDEN DAM EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT TESTING

Please be aware that the Town of Chittenden as well as Green Mountain Power are doing testing on their emergency sirens during the month of November. If you are signed up for VT ALERT, you may be notified of the testing.

Chittenden's scheduled day is November 14, 2023 at 8:30am for their whistles to go off. VT ALERT is scheduled to send a message the week before and another one 15 minutes before the sirens go off.

Green Mountain Power is doing a monthly growl test that barely makes a sound, but if you are near the siren and hear a bit of a growl from it, they are doing their monthly testing of the system.

PITTSFORD VILLAGE FARM UPDATE

Pittsford Village Farm is a 22 acre property in the heart of downtown Pittsford that is open and accessible for all to share!

Despite the unusually wet summer, Pittsford Village Farm hosted a number of wonderful events this summer, some new to us and some old favorites. For the first time, Farm to Ballet (and over 300 audience members) joined us for a beautiful evening on the knoll in July; Castleton Archaeology led an Artifacts Road Show event in August; and we partnered again with the Paramount Theater of Rutland for 4 new performances (although all but 1 had to be moved or canceled due to rain!) Other firsts this summer included monthly "Garden Gatherings" talks in the Pavilion and near the garden and a morning bird walk & talk led by Sue Wetmore. We also continued our Tunesday Concert Series, with both new and old artists and an attendance of about 100 on average. Finally, our annual Touch-A-Truck event in September drew a crowd of over 300 people.

In addition to our public events, the Pittsford Village Farm volunteer board continues to work toward our goal of renovating the nearly 6,000 square foot Farm House and converting it to a child care center, a community gathering space, cafe and two affordable apartments. Our volunteers continue their vigorous fundraising efforts to bring us to our goal of breaking ground next spring! The huge success we see over the summer at our fully-attended events motivates us to continue forward!
